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

Make The Most of Storytime **FREE EVENT for Spinney Parents of EYFS, Y1 and Y2 Children**

As parents and carers will be aware we have been involved in a year long project as a pioneer school with [EmpathyLab](#). This has been a very successful initiative and in partnership with Bewick Bridge we have worked on various elements including Teacher Training, the EmpathyLab Big Read and Write at Lady Mitchell Hall and The Empathy Awards. Last week all of KS2 visited Bewick Bridge for an Empathy afternoon which included a visit from Ross Montgomery (which can actually be seen on the [EmpathyLab website!](#)) and now we would like to tell you about another wonderful activity for Spinney and Bewick Bridge families too.

A **Reading Together Workshop** will take place on Wednesday 27th June at Cherry Hinton Library and is being led by Courtney Froehlig. The aim is to help you to promote thinking and communication through storytime. Topics covered include bringing more enjoyment, connection, and conversation to storytime, supporting your child's social perspective-taking and relational reasoning, building your child's confidence in communicating and explaining their ideas. The focus is for parents and carers of children in Early Years Foundation Stage and Years 1 and 2, however it will be useful for all parents. The Spinney Wraparound Care offer: Breakfast Club and After School Provision

The Spinney Wraparound Care offer provides care before and after school for Spinney pupils. We offer a safe, stimulating and happy environment where children are supervised by committed, professional Spinney staff. If you would like to enroll your child in either of these clubs, forms are available from the office team or downloadable from the school website from Monday. From the autumn term Breakfast Club will cost £4 per child (£3.50 for siblings) and After School Club will be £12 per session.

Breakfast provision

In preparation for a busy school day, the Breakfast Club offer focuses on quieter activities such as Lego, arts and crafts, puzzles, toys and board games.

Provision starts at 8:00am and the children are offered a selection of cereal, toast, yoghurt, fruit and juice. After breakfast, there is a range of activities on offer including board games, drawing, reading and construction play. Staff take children onto the playground for some fresh air at 8:45am ready for the school day to start at 8:55am.

After School provision

After School provision runs from the end of the school day and finishes at 6:00pm.

On arrival, children have a snack to keep them going. There are plenty of games and activities to keep everyone occupied, including jigsaws, board games and a 'comfy corner' with cushions to read and relax.

When weather permits, staff take children onto the playground for a run around and some fun and games.
