

## Headteacher's reflections:

As many parents are aware The Spinney is one of only 15 Ashoka Changemaker Schools in England and is part of a larger network across the world of some 200 schools, colleges and Universities who in addition to promoting academic excellence also promote compassion, collaboration, creativity and problem solving skills in order to make the world an even better place. Next week I have been invited to be a speaker at the [Yidan Prize Conference: Educating for The Future](#) at Jesus College and will also be attending the European Changemaker Education Summit in Lyon. This will be an opportunity to share ideas with other Changemaker schools, global education thought leaders and innovators from around the world.

As an Ashoka Changemaker school we believe it is important to give our pupils the literacies, competencies and qualities to be happy and successful now and in the future as well as the confidence to become changemakers. In practice this involves providing learning experiences which foster skills such as leadership, responsibility, collaboration and the confidence to keep improving the world for the good of all. Our rounded holistic curriculum promotes oracy, problem solving, kindness and empathy. And through home learning and project based activities we encourage the children to understand that learning is not limited to the school environment but takes place anywhere in a variety of forms. Giving children control over their learning develops self-regulation and autonomy and empowers children to make decisions for themselves, encourages good time management and allows for creativity. Sharing the work they have produced with their peers also develops their speaking and listening skills. I am always impressed by the quality and standard of the work they do at home and there is a wonderful diversity and creativity in the way the children present their projects.

In my absence Mr Mawson and Mrs Jelliman will ensure that the school continues to work with the high standards of excellence, cogence and joy that we value at The Spinney.

### School Access and Child Safety

We have recently reviewed our school access arrangements and we have highlighted certain areas of improvement. In light of our new afterschool club we have made some important changes to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our children. The gate between the school playground and field will be locked at 3.30pm each day. Children are welcome to play on the field if they are supervised by their parent or carer. We will also be keeping the main carpark gates locked so that we can better monitor access during school hours. Our children's safety is extremely important and I am sure you will appreciate the need to review and improve our procedures. We very much appreciate your support in this matter.



### School Disco

The School Disco takes place on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> February in the school hall. The Foundation and KS1 disco will be held 4.30-5.45pm and the KS2 disco will be held 6-7.30pm.
